Second Annual TUNB Summer Trip Scheduled July 13-17

This year's chapter trip will be held July 13-17. Our destination is the Black Canyon of the Gunnison and surrounding areas.

The trip will begin with three days of optional organized activities centered around the Black Canyon Anglers (BCA) lodge on the Gunnison River in Colorado. BCA will offer chapter members discounted lodging and fishing at \$60/night in shared cabins, with outdoor cooking facilities and an optional dining room dinner service. They provide guide services for the Black Canyon, have a fly shop on-site, and have several miles of private access to the Gunnison on their property. You can learn more about their operation at http://www.blackcanyonanglers.com . Camping is also available nearby.

Members will meet up at BCA on Monday. On Tuesday, July 14 there will be a chapter fishing day, with a group floating the legendary canyon and others venturing to wade-in waters. BCA will be providing heavily discounted float trips to our members, covering 14 miles of water.

On Wednesday, BCA will organize tours of the some of the legendary production shops in the Carbondale area, including the Scott Rod factory, the Ross Reels factory, and Whiting Farms. Members can ride along as they desire, or fish the Gunnison through the BCA property.

On Thursday, a second chapter fishing day will be held at Sunshine Springs Angling Club. This unique location consists of eight spring-fed ponds that hold five species of trout. Many fish run 5 lbs, and they can run up to 14 lbs. The Club will discount their rod fee for the day to \$55 for our members.

For those who remain Friday and Saturday, groups will self-organize for trips over to the Roaring Fork and Frying Pan, further explore the Gunnison, or start to fish their way back to Iowa. Guide trips will also be available for those interested.

Individuals are, as usual, responsible for their own expenses and gear. Families and friends are welcome. The chapter is only coordinating the reservations and rates for the BCA nights, and providing information on the region and other options. The chapter is not formally coordinating offsite lodging--but we'll put all of those planning to camp in touch with each other.

Bob Bernard is coordinating this year's trip, and those intending to participate should contact him so he can arrange space for the activities of interest. He'll also maintain the list, work to arrange carpooling if desired, and otherwise keep us all updated. Bob can be contacted at bearbernard46@gmail.com or at 515.494.3434.

Most reservations can be made until well into June, but if you want to stay at the lodge it is recommended you contact Bob by early May.

We'll have the downloadable trip packet ready by the March meeting, and we'll post a link to the complete document with the full costs and details in the March newsletter. (Bob will send those out to those who contact him in advance once they are ready.)

We hope you'll be able to join us.

Volunteers Needed for Scout Fishing Day

The scouts from New Virginia we worked with last year to complete the tying portion of their merit

badge still haven't found time for a day of fishing to complete the "catching" portion. They've asked if we could help them find a suitable location this spring, and perhaps a few volunteers to help keep the casts out of the trees.

We'll be looking for a farm pond or public lake with a nice stretch of bank 8-10 kids can spread out on, and where we can get to fish without long casts. There is no rush, so we're aiming for late April or early May to avoid weather problems.

If you know of a good potential location we could use for an afternoon (preferably between Des Moines and Osceola), or are willing to spend a few hours helping a scout get started on the water (and working the rust out of your own cast), contact Bob Bernard or Brett Lorenzen.

And this is a good time for our annual reminder that we can always use a few dozen extra flies for events like this. If you found the time to tie a surplus this winter, or need to do some fly box cleaning, we'd be happy to take donations of common nypmhs, dries and panfish flies in sizes 12 and 14. They can be brought to a meeting, or you can contact Bob or Brett for mailing instructions.
